**Insurance and Safety**

Members are reminded that the Society has only public liability insurance and that personal accident insurance is a matter for individual members to arrange as they consider necessary. Up to date hard hats are obligatory for all field excursions involving quarries or cliff faces and strongly recommended for all trips. High visibility clothing is sometimes required in working quarries. High visibility tabards can be obtained from GA Enterprises, 126 Fleetside, W. Molesey, Surrey KT8 2NQ at £4.70 incl. pp. Members without suitable hard hats may be refused access to certain sites! Hard hats can be obtained from many Builders' Merchants, Wickes, B&Q Warehouse etc. for about £4.

Any non-members attending field excursions will have to pay a temporary membership fee of £2.00 and all participants are reminded that they must comply with any instructions from excursion leaders or, for example, quarry managers or their employees on Health & Safety issues.

## **SUMMER 2009 FIELD MEETINGS**

**Wednesday, 20th May - 3.30pm - 6.00pm**

### **Lodge House Opencast coal site near Smalley Derbyshire**

**Leaders : Paul Guion, Alan Ashburn and Brian Worsley (UK Coal)**

Meeting place : Meet at the UK Coal Lodge House Opencast site site offices (Post code DE7 6DW). The offices are situated to the southeast of the A608 and are reached by an access road marked 'UK Coal', just south of Holly Mount Farm (SK 412 451). Follow the road to the site office and park in the car park to the right.

The site works the Waterloo group of coal seams of Pennsylvanian age. The coals are interbedded with coarsening upward sequences of claystones and siltstones representing the infills of shallow lakes. The manner of operation of the site will be explained and the workings will be visited in order to view the method of overburden stripping and coal extraction

**Please note : Numbers are very limited so you must register prior to the date of the visit. You will be required to wear hard hats and high visibility jackets. It is likely to be muddy so wellingtons are recommended**

**Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> June - 6.30pm**

### **Evening visit to local Triassic sites around Nottingham**

Meeting place The Hemlock Stone rock (SK 499 387), Stapleford Hill

The evening will be spent visiting a number of sites in the Triassic rocks of the Nottingham area starting at the Hemlock Stone the Lenton Sandstone and the Nottingham Castle Sandstone. We will then move over to look at another exposure of the Nottingham Castle Sandstone at the University of Nottingham and finish in a quarry in Carlton where the Tarporley Siltstone is exposed.

**Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> June - 6.30pm**

### **Evening visit to Ecton Hill copper mines.**

Meeting place Layby at Ecton, 1Km. east of Warslow village. (SK 4096 3583 ) Turn east off the B5054 at the north end of Warslow along an unclassified road signposted Ecton. Turn right at the T junction and park in layby 200m. on left. **Note** – there is no phone reception in Ecton

The Ecton copper mines consist of major vertical pipes in thin bedded Dinantian strata. They were very productive in the 18C when they provided a large income for the Duke of Devonshire. Elsewhere both the large vertical pipes and the copper mineralisation are unknown in the South Pennines orefield.

The visit will include an underground visit to Salts Level where excellent faulting and folding can be seen as well as the Ecton pipe and main shaft. Before or after the mine visit there will be a walk to the top of Ecton Hill to see the main engine house , the top of the Ecton pipe and fine views.

**Please note: Numbers are restricted and pre-booking is essential. Hard hats and high visibility jackets should be worn.**

**Weekend visit to Hertfordshire**

It is a pleasure to be invited by the Hertfordshire Geological Society who will be our hosts for this weekend. It is intended that we should meet in the **Verulamium Museum in St. Albans at 7.30pm for an introductory talk on Friday evening – 10<sup>th</sup> July.**

For those people who would wish to travel to Hertfordshire on the Saturday morning a convenient meeting place and time will be given on request.

During the weekend we will have the opportunity to look at various parts of the Chalk sequence, including the Chalk Rock and the Totternhoe Stone, the basal Tertiary deposits, landscape history of the Chilterns ( Pliocene at Little Heath), the proto- Thames terraces and features of the Chiltern scarp, the last including canal history.

St Albans would be an excellent place to stay for the weekend and we have details of accommodation for you.

This should be an excellent weekend to an area the Society has hardly visited before. Please will you indicate if you will be meeting our leaders at the museum on the Friday evening or are intending to travel to Hertfordshire on the Saturday morning (provisional starting time 9.30am).
