Insurance and Safety

Members are reminded that the Society has only public liability insurance and that personal accident insurance is a matter for individual members to arrange as they consider necessary. Up to date hard hats are obligatory for all field excursions involving quarries or cliff faces and strongly recommended for all trips. High visibility clothing is sometimes required in working quarries. High visibility tabards can be obtained from GA Enterprises, 126 Fleetside, W. Molesey, Surrey KT8 2NQ at £4.70 incl. pp. Members without suitable hard hats may be refused access to certain sites!

Hard hats can be obtained from many Builders' Merchants, Wickes, B&Q Warehouse etc. for about £4.

Any non-members attending field excursions will have to pay a temporary membership fee of £2.00 and all participants are reminded that they must comply with any instructions from excursion leaders or, for example, quarry managers or their employees on Health & Safety issues.

<u>Sunday, 20th May – Day Excursion to Wren's Nest, Dudley and the Saltwells Local</u> <u>Nature Reserve</u>

Meeting time: 10.30 am – finish about 4pm

<u>Meeting place</u>: Meet at Wrens Nest at the large college car park on the top of the hill next to Wrens Hill Road and just back from the Caves Public House, also on Wrens Nest Road.

The aim of the excursion is to look at the Silurian geology and features of the inlier of Wrens Nest Hill and also to investigate the Coal Measures geology of the Saltwells Nature Reserve. Wrens Nest has long been famous for its tremendous wealth of beautifully preserved Silurian fossils including the trilobite Calymene (the Dudley locust) and a vast range of corals, brachiopods, crinoids and molluscs.

Getting to Wrens Nest: From the Nottingham area the easiest route is via the A42, M42 to its junction with the M6, and then north on the M6 to the M5. Take the M5 and exit at junction 2. Follow the A4123 towards Dudley and to a large traffic junction where the A461 crosses the A4123. Continue on the A4123 and after ½ mile is the junction with Tipton Road. Continue along the A4123 to the next set of lights with a large pub called the King Arthur Carvery. Turn left here into Priory Road. Take the first right into Mayfield Road and follow this uphill until you come to Linwood Road. Turn right into Linwood Road and at the end of the road take a steep left hand turn up through the nature reserve (Wrens Hill Road. At the summit the large college buildings are on your left-hand side.

Wednesday, 23rd May - The Limestone Reefs of the Manifold Valley

Meeting time: 6.30 pm

Meeting place: On the west bank of the River Manifold opposite the National Trust Tea Rooms at Wettonmill. Grid ref: SK 0947 5610.

This will be a 3 mile circular walk in the superb setting of the Manifold Valley. The main object of the evening walk will be to inspect the Carboniferous limestone reef structures in the valley, although there are many other facets of interest in this lovely location.

Wednesday, 20th June - Evening Walk, The Nottingham Rock Cemetery

Meeting time: 6.30 pm

<u>Meeting place</u>: At the entrance gates on Mansfield Road, Nottingham, opposite St Andrews Church, at the junction of Forest Road and Mansfield Road.

It is many years since we were led around this venue by Eric Robinson and those who went on that occasion will remember the wealth of material interest to the geologist. This includes the wide range of rock types used in the grave stones, the Triassic sandstone outcrops with excellent

sedimentary features and the quarrying activity. Tim and Neil will lead us on what should be a fascinating evening.

Saturday 14th/Sunday 15th July - Weekend excursion to the Mendips

Meeting Time: On Saturday 14th July – 10.15 am

<u>Meeting Place</u>: The Burrington Inn and Car Park in Burrington Coombe. Post code: BS40 7AT. Grid Ref: ST 476 589.

This is an exciting area geologically with its superb Variscan fold structures and limestone geomorphology. Burrington Coombe, which is a valley originally formed in Triassic times and now re-excavated, provides a wonderful section through the Upper Devonian and Lower Carboniferous and will form our focus for the features of the Mendips. During the weekend we will also visit some classic unconformities in the neighbourhood of Frome to the east of the main Mendip Hills.

Sunday, 2nd September – Day excursion to the Lincolnshire Wolds

Meeting Time: 10.15 am

Meeting Place: Horncastle Market Place

The day trip to the Wolds will take us to an area not only dominated by the Chalk but also of much interest from the Lower Cretaceous and uppermost Jurassic rocks of the inner escarpments in the river valleys within the Wolds. Additionally the influence of the Pleistocene glaciation and the geomorphological features that have resulted, together with post glacial features, will be revealed by our leader who has a lifetime of interest and study of the area.
